Overview

The Federal Home Loan Bank of Dallas (FHLB Dallas or Bank) Capacity Building and Growth Grant Program will provide grants to Community Development Financial Institution (CDFI) Loan Funds to enhance their ability to support the needs of the communities they serve. CDFI Loan Funds with a focus on affordable housing, small business lending, and community economic development will be ideal candidates for this grant program. CDFI Loan Funds may apply for 'Monetary Grants' or 'Technical Expertise Grants'.

Eligibility Requirements

Institutions eligible for grants under this program are **CDFI Loan Funds** that are:

- Members of FHLB Dallas, or sponsored by a member institution;
- Located in FHLB Dallas district (i.e., Arkansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, New Mexico, and Texas);
- Certified as a CDFI by the United States Treasury's CDFI Fund;
- Focused on affordable housing, small business lending or community economic development;
 and
- Able to provide financial statements, audited if available

Types of Grants

A. Monetary Grants (Pages 3-7)

Monetary grants may be used for a variety of purposes including, for example, operational or technology improvements, leadership or expertise development, and developing new sources of income. In evaluating grant applications, the Bank will give significant weight to the expected impact of the planned actions that would be facilitated by the grant. Other considerations include, but are not limited to, the CDFI Loan Fund's capacity to execute the planned project or initiative, alignment of the project or initiative with the Bank's mission, and the expected governance and oversight of the project or initiative.

B. Technical Expertise Grants (Pages 8-11)

Technical expertise grants may be used to build upon or augment a CDFI Loan Fund's capacity in the areas of (i) communication and marketing strategy or (ii) small-scale automation. Technical expertise grants are limited to \$50,000 (time and materials). Such grants may leverage the skills of FHLB Dallas staff or external resources to a limited degree. The Bank will conduct a feasibility review of technical expertise grant submissions to determine whether the Bank's resources can provide the appropriate level of support requested and result in a commensurate level of impact. This review process will, in most cases, require additional dialogue between the Bank and CDFI Loan Fund grant applicant to define the scope and requirements of the associated project or initiative. The Bank reserves the right not to award any such grants based on the results of its review of LOI submissions.

The Bank will accept LOIs for both grant types from members through 5 p.m. (Central Time) on April 17, 2024.

A. Monetary Grants

Monetary grants may be used for a variety of purposes including, for example, operational or technology improvements, leadership or expertise development, and developing new sources of income. In evaluating grant applications, the Bank will give significant weight to the expected impact of the planned actions that would be facilitated by the grant. Other considerations include, but are not limited to, the CDFI Loan Fund's capacity to execute the planned project or initiative, alignment of the project or initiative with the Bank's mission, and the expected governance and oversight of the project or initiative.

Grant funds may not be used for general operating expenses, litigation, support of existing programs (unless there is a significant change in focus or strategy), conferences, publications, media/audiovisual productions, or financial deficits.

CDFI Loan Funds that are current FHLB Dallas members may apply for grants from \$50,000 - \$500,000. CDFI Loan Funds that are not current FHLB Dallas members may apply for grants from \$50,000 to \$100,000.

CDFI Loan Funds should apply for a monetary grant using the 2024 CDFI Capacity Building and Growth Grant Letter of Inquiry – Monetary Grant. Only one LOI may be submitted by a CDFI Loan Fund for a monetary grant. CDFI Loan Funds that are not current FHLB Dallas members must submit a Letter of Inquiry (LOI) through a current FHLB Dallas member. FHLB Dallas members submitting LOIs on behalf of CDFI Loan Funds make no representations regarding the CDFI Loan Fund or LOI.

1. Letter of Inquiry (LOI) Submissions

CDFI Loan Funds that are current FHLB Dallas members may submit LOIs directly to FHLB Dallas. CDFI Loan Funds that are not FHLB Dallas members must have a current FHLB Dallas member (regardless of institution type) submit the LOI on their behalf. LOIs for monetary grants must be submitted to capacitygrants@fhlb.com by 5 p.m. (Central Time) on April 17th.

2. Formal Proposal Submissions

Following its review of the LOI submissions, FHLB Dallas will invite some monetary grant applicants to submit formal proposals, the format for which will be provided by FHLB Dallas. Formal proposals offer the applicant the opportunity to provide greater detail regarding CDFI Loan Fund itself and the proposed use of the grant funds. The Bank's evaluation of formal proposals will consider, among other things, the CDFI Loan Fund's alignment with the FHLB Dallas mission and its capacity to execute the proposed actions, with a significant emphasis on the potential for impact. The award of any grant will be at the sole discretion of the Bank.

3. Disbursement of Grant Funds

Funds awarded to a CDFI Loan Fund will be disbursed to that CDFI Loan Fund if it is a current member of the Bank. Funds awarded to a nonmember CDFI Loan Fund will be disbursed to the sponsoring member institution on behalf of CDFI Loan Fund.

4. Funds Use Certification and Impact Reporting

Monetary grant recipients will be required to provide any funds use certifications and impact reporting requested by the Bank.

5. Fair Lending

Grant funds awarded under the Capacity Building and Growth Grant Program must be used in compliance with all applicable fair lending laws.

B. Technical Expertise Grants

Technical expertise grants may be used to build upon or augment a CDFI Loan Fund's capacity in the areas of (i) communication and marketing strategy or (ii) small-scale automation. Technical expertise grants are limited to \$50,000 (time and materials). Such grants may leverage the skills of FHLB Dallas staff or external resources to a limited degree. The Bank will conduct a feasibility review of technical expertise grant submissions to determine whether the Bank's resources can provide the appropriate level of support requested and result in a commensurate level of impact. This review process will, in most cases, require additional dialogue between the Bank and CDFI Loan Fund grant applicant to define the scope and requirements of the associated project or initiative. The Bank reserves the right not to award any such grants based on the results of its review of LOI submissions.

CDFI Loan Funds should apply for a technical expertise grant using the <u>2024 CDFI Capacity Building and Growth Grant Letter of Inquiry – Technical Expertise Grant</u>. Only one LOI may be submitted by a CDFI Loan Fund for a technical expertise grant.

1. Letter of Inquiry (LOI) Submissions

CDFI Loan Funds that are current FHLB Dallas members may submit LOIs directly to FHLB Dallas. CDFI Loan Funds that are not FHLB Dallas members must have a current FHLB Dallas member (regardless of institution type) submit the LOI on their behalf. LOIs for technical expertise grants must be submitted to capacitygrants@fhlb.com by 5 p.m. (Central Time) on April 17th.

2. Interview Process

Following its initial review of the LOI submissions, FHLB Dallas will conduct clarifying due diligence interviews with applicants. The intent of these interviews will be to a.) Understand the purpose, requirements, and scope of the human effort required, b.) Define expectations, c.) Collaborate on potential solutions. After interviews, the Bank will assess applications to determine which applications may receive technical expertise grants.

3. Funds Use Certification and Impact Reporting

Technical expertise grant recipients will be required to provide any funds use certifications and impact reporting requested by the Bank.

4. Fair Lending

Grant funds awarded under the Capacity Building and Growth Grant Program must be used in compliance with all applicable fair lending laws.
